## M.Phil (English) (SEMESTER-III)

#### DISSERTATION

As a part fulfillment each student will be required to write a dissertation on a topic of his/her choice under the supervision of a Research Guide.

- The dissertation shall be evaluated by the internal examiner (the guide) as well as by an external examiner appointed as per the university rules. The procedure for evaluation of dissertation, conduct of final seminar and viva voce and the declaration of final result shall be as laid down in the university rules
- 2. The exact title of the Dissertation shall be intimated within one month after the completion of the written examination.
- 3. Candidates shall submit the Dissertation to the College through the Supervisor and the Head of the department within six months from the commencement of the semester. It shall be evalued by internal examiner (supervisor) and one external examiner appointed by the College from a panel of three names sent by the Supervisor through the Head of the department.
- 4. The examiners who value the Dissertation shall report on the merit of candidates as Highly Commended (75 % and above) or Commended (50% and above and below 75%) Not Commended (below 50%) If one examiner commends the Dissertation and other examiner does not commend, the Dissertation will be referred to a third examiner and the third valuation shall be final.
- 5. Submission or resubmission of the Dissertation will be allowed twice a year.
- 6. Viva Voce: Conducted by the Head of the Department along with the External and Internal Examiners.
- 7. The dissertation should be a minimum of 100 pages.
- 8. If the dissertation is evaluated as 'not commended' by the examiner, the student has to resubmit the dissertation within the stipulated time of three months. In case the dissertation is again evaluated as 'not commended', the student shall seek special permission from the Principal for re-resubmission.
